Promise to Each Other Separately

Do promise to respect and honor her/him, sharing your plans and interests, ideals and emotions, through all the trials and tribulations of life, as well as the joyous times, caring for her/him in lifelong commitment. "I do."

(Promises to the Children if applicable) Optional

Do the two of you promise to honor, respect, love, and provide for his/her children as your very own?

Do the two of you promise to do your part in making this home a haven for trust, laughter, safety and security?

Do the two of you promise to gladly accept any and all obligations and responsibilities attached to this new relationship with these children?

Marriage Vows

I, *Groom/Bride* - take you, *Bride/Groom* - to be my wedded wife/husband - to have and to hold - from this day forward - for better, for worse - for richer, for poorer - sickness and in health - to love and to cherish - until death do us part.

Rings

"This ring I give you - in token and pledge - of my constant faith - and abiding love. - on this day and forever - I gladly I choose you to be my *wife/husband* - Bride/Groom, do you accept this ring as a pledge of the sincerity of his vows?"

Ring Prayer / Blessing

With these ring you shall not walk alone. May your hearts be your shelter and my arms be your home. May God bless you always. May you walk together through all things. May you feel deeply loved, for indeed you are. May you always see the innocence in each other's eyes. May you feel this joy forever.

- ❖ These are the hands that will tenderly lift your chin and brush your cheeks as they raise your face to look into his eyes that are filled completely with overwhelming love and desire.
